


Over a 1000 people were treated to the wonderful production created by students from Swanlea and Thomas Buxton Primary school called "Conversations".

SWANLEA PARENTS DIVE INTO OCEAN MATHS



Parents of Year 7 students were invited into school to take part in a Maths lesson with a difference! Ocean Maths involves children learning maths with their parents and working together to solve mathematical questions and puzzles. The workshops are very interactive and parents do not have to be good at Maths to attend. By participating in these workshops, parents develop ways to support their children with maths at home and as part of the Ocean Maths programme, students

are also given Ocean Maths homework which they are asked to complete with their parents.

In one term alone, 84 Year 7 parents attended an Ocean Maths class and there has been a very positive response to the workshops. One parent commented

- The Year 7 & 8 Girls Indoor Cricket team placed 4th against local borough schools.
- Under 13s Boys Cricket team were finalists in the London Indoor Cricket Competition held at Lords Cricket ground. The boys were also the winners in the Middlesex Indoor competition held also at Lords.
- Under 13s were recently defeated in the Indoor Inner London Cricket Skills Cup by Stepney Green.
- Under 15s Boys reached the London Finals of the

National 'Times Newspaper' Cricket tournament and were defeated by Dulwich College.

- Under 15s qualified for the Indoor Cricket Tower Hamlets Finals. They have also qualified for the Tower Hamlets Outdoor Cricket Tournaments to be played in the Summer.

ROWING

Swanlea came second in this year's Tower Hamlets Indoor Rowing Competition at Oaklands School. These students were also chosen to represent Tower Hamlets in the London Youth Games: a considerable achievement.
