## Curriculum Year 9

- Students move into Black uniform at the end of Year 8 to formalise their progression through the school
- Humanities remains a core subject - students continue to study Geography \& History in Year 9
- MFL at Swanlea is a high value subject and so students continue to study this in Year 9
- Performing Arts is key in developing our students confidence and resilience and so this also remains a core subject in Year 9


## Curriculum Year 9

- Early entry subjects are a key part of supporting our students' confidence, allowing them to experience success early
- Consequently, all students study GCSE RE in Years 9-10 \& also select one 'Creative subject' alongside this
- We have a wide range of GCSE \& BTEC pathways of equal value to GCSEs, to meet the differing needs of our students

- We have provided an informative Year 8 options assembly, discussing the importance of year 8 options and the factors to consider when making a choice.
- Students have been looking at careers and how to make informed choices through our Aspire week programme, as well as PSHEE and leadership lessons.
- Pupils will be watching a short narrated PowerPoint from all Heads of Departments, where each subject will be discussed in depth and students can review their suitability for them as learners.

## Curriculum Year 10

- Students formally move to Key Stage 4 at the start of Year 10
- To retain a 'broad and balanced curriculum' students continue to study a 'core' offer
- To support student interest, there is the opportunity to further specialise in key subjects


## Curriculum Year 10

- As an EBAC, high-status facilitating subject, students select one Humanities subject - History or Geography (Option A)
- Option B is a guided pathway, the majority of students will continue with their Modern Foreign Language
- Some students will be invited onto a vocational pathway, based on their best interests


## Curriculum Year 10

- RE \& the Creative Option subject selected last year will be examined in the summer of Year 10
- All other subjects will be examined at the end of Year 11

## Options Process - Next Steps

- Students receive their options booklet
- Link to online form sent out
- Read the booklet carefully
- On the online form, select one option choice giving $1^{\text {st }}$, $2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}$ preferences from the subjects available
- Remember these are preferred choices - not guaranteed
- Most students will receive one of their top 2 choices and all should receive one from their top 3
- Completed online forms should be submitted by Monday 17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ April 2023
