- Evaluating their own work
- Team working; presentation skills; independent working; working to deadlines; efficient use of resources.

How Will I Be Assessed?

Pupils are assessed regularly both on theory and practical work.

To be awarded the Level 1 or Level 2 Technical Award in Graphic Design, students are required to successfully complete six mandatory units for each qualification.

Content area 3:	Requirements of a graphic design brief	
Content area 4:	Planning, development and experimentation	
Content area 5:	Graphic design production	
Content area 6:	Design, present and promote graphic design work	

The qualification has 2 assessments externally-set by NCFE: one non-exam assessment and one written examined assessment.
